THE HERSCHER SIBLINGS

Mary Herscher (24 May 1832) Jacob Herscher (15 Dec 1834) Frederick Herscher (17 Oct 1839) John Herscher (24 May 1842)

All of the Herscher siblings were born in Vogelgrun, Haut-Rhin, Alsace France. They all immigrated to the United States on July 5, 1851 with their parents, except for Frederick who came later..

The family located in Wayne County, New York and came to Illinois in 1854. In 1855 they settled in Pilot Township.

It is at that point that I pick up on the lives of each of the siblings.

Because John and Frederick files are quite large, I will include them in an upcoming Supplemental Newsletter.

MARY ANNE HERSCHER

Mary Anne Herscher married Alexander Ehrenreich Betz on February 2, 1856 in Kankakee, IL. After their marriage, Mary and Alexander rented ground in Pilot Township and became a farming family. Then they bought property in Section 4 of Pilot Township on November 23, 1863 and continued life as farmers.

Alexander and Mary bought Lots 8 & 9 in Block 12 on S. Main on 30 Oct 1880 which is 241 S. Main. They probably built a house on that lot for their retirement, but I can't say that for sure. A modern house sets on that lot now.

Mary and Alexander were the parents of William (1856-1880), George (1858-1876). Edward (1860-1883), Amelia (1863-1941), Julia (1866-1900), Emma (1874-1952), and Louis (1875-1894).

The descendants are numerous in the Herscher area with names like Schlaich, Mau, Siedentop, Smith, etc.

Mary Anne Betz died on 10 Dec 1882 and is buried at the Zion Lutheran Cemetery on Rte 17.

JACOB HERSCHER

We know that John Herscher was the founder of Herscher and began building the Village in 1878. However, John died in 1885 and his brother Frederick masterfully continued on with the development of Herscher. They also had a brother named Jacob. So what do we know about Jacob?

- 1834 born in Alsace, France
- 1851 immigrated to the US
- 1854 resident of Cook Co. IL
- 1858 married Mary Sophia Burgess
- 1859 had a daughter named Ellie who died the next year
- 1860 Census Salina Township
- 1861 had a son named Adelbert
- 1 Oct 1861 Enlisted in Co. B, 113th IL. Infantry
- 4 Nov 1863 died of disease at Corinth, MS during the battle of Vicksburg on a sanitary ship.
- 1863 buried at Veterans Cemetery, Vicksburg, MS is one possibility. The other possibility is that he is buried at Zion Lutheran Cemetery.
 In an email from Craig Chapman (mentioned below) "Jacob died at Vicksburg but family tradition claims that his wife was with him in Corinth when he died. I would've thought that she would bring his body back to Illinois for burial. Maybe she didn't have the money to pay for moving him."

There is no record of Jacob being buried at Zion other than by Find-a-Grave.

Jacob wrote a letter to Frederick from Vicksburg in 1863 which was donated to the Wisconsin Historical Society. If you are interested in viewing that letter, please contact me at robertlvoss@aol.com

Jacob's son, Adelbert, moved to Oklahoma and fathered six children.

One of his daughter's name was Mary Maud. Mary married Ingle Jerde Sr.

They had a son named Ingle (Jr.) who had a daughter named Mary Ann. Adelbert would be Mary Ann's great grandfather.

Mary Ann married Craig Chapman and currently live in North Carolina. Mary Ann and Craig visited Herscher in 2018.
